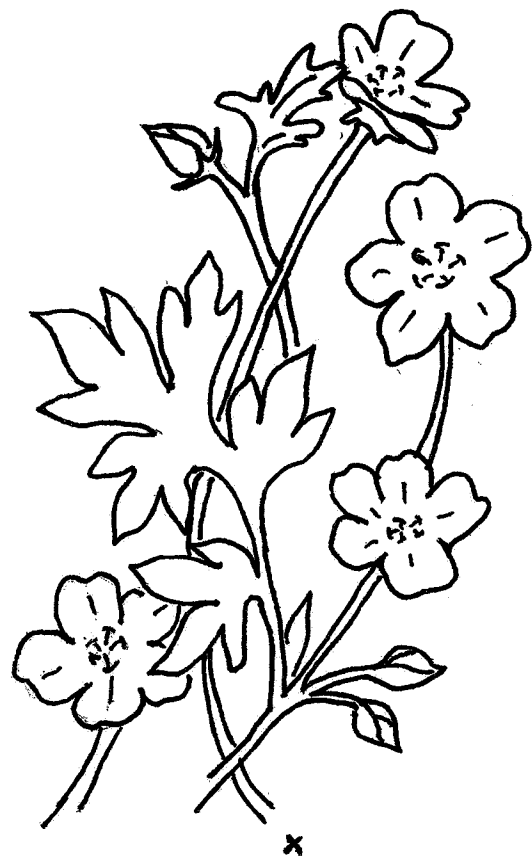
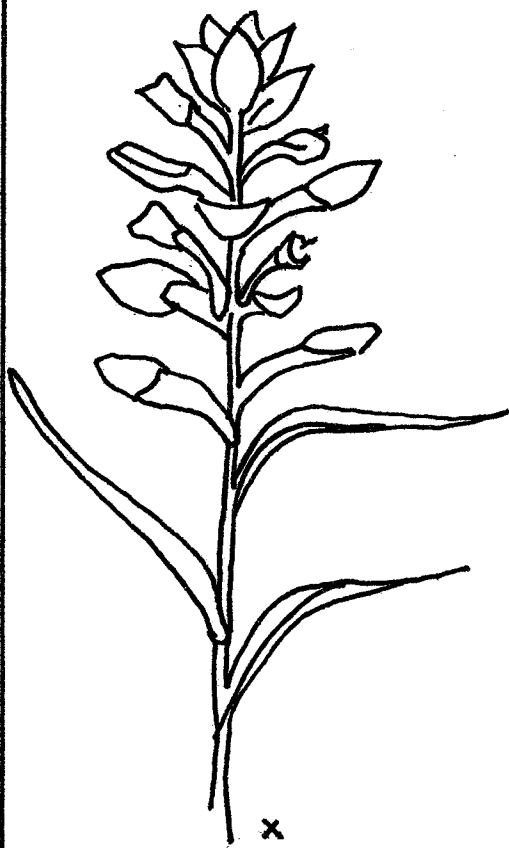

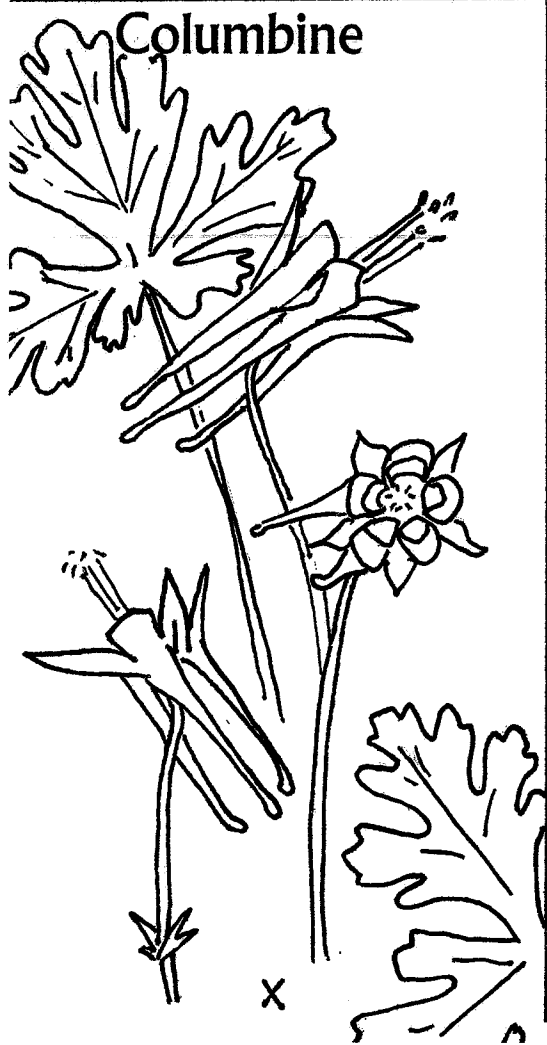
Texas Paintbrush

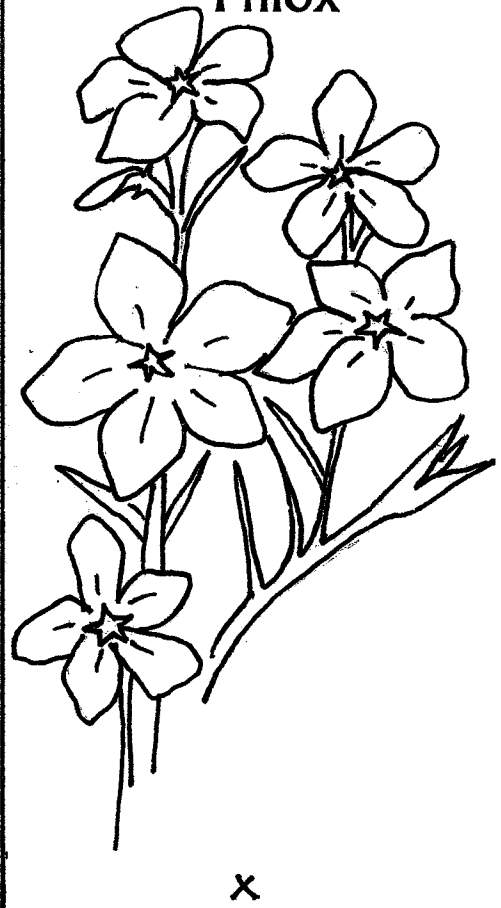

Golden-Eye Phlox



Giant Spiderwort
Tradescantia gigantean

Flower color may vary from lavender-blue to pink. It grows 1-3ft. tall. The narrow leaves grow 4-12 inches long.
Blooms: March to April.

Texas Paintbrush
Castilleja indivisa

The upper half of each leaf-like bract is bright red. The actual flower is about one inch long, slender, and yellow-green. It grows to 6-18 inches tall.
Blooms: March to May.

Baby Blue-Eyes
Nemophila phacelioides

Light-blue to light-purple with a large white eye.
Flowers are small (1/2-3/4 inches wide). Oblong leaves may be 3 inches long divided into 5-11 segments. Stems may be 6-18 inches long, sometimes lying down on the ground.
Blooms: March to May.

Golden-Eye Phlox
Phlox Roemeriana

Rose to pink flower with a bright yellow eye.
The plant is usually low growing 3-5 inches tall.
Blooms: February to May.

Texas Bluebonnet
Lupinus texensis

Blue and white flowers grow around the stem covering 1 1/2 to 4 inches. Leaves form a star with five leaves growing from the end of a short stem. The plant grows 8-16 inches tall.
Blooms: March to May.

Columbine
Aquilegia Canadensis

The flower petals are yellow and the petal spurs are red. Red sepals form the shape of a star around the yellow flower. Flowers are 1-1 1/2 inches long growing on stalks 1-2 feet tall. Leaves are divided into 3 parts 2 or 3 times.
Blooms: March to May.
